If rural Texas districts receive:



Expert CCMR Technical Assistance and Coaching

- Accessing, compiling, and analyzing CCMR data
- Developing a data-driven CCMR Strategic Plan
- Coaching, accountability, and support to implement the plan



Start-up and Bridge Resources

- Dedicated Student Success Advisor
- Pre-vetted and procured programs focused on improving student results in 3 areas: TSI-Met, College Enrollment, Career Credential Attainment

and maintain a laser focus on the rigorous CCMR Outcomes Bonus Criteria

Then more students will be equipped to select, transition, and succeed in a post-secondary pathway of their choosing

And districts will be positioned to receive increased CCMR Outcomes Bonus funding to sustain the successful CCMR programs and student supports they have implemented.

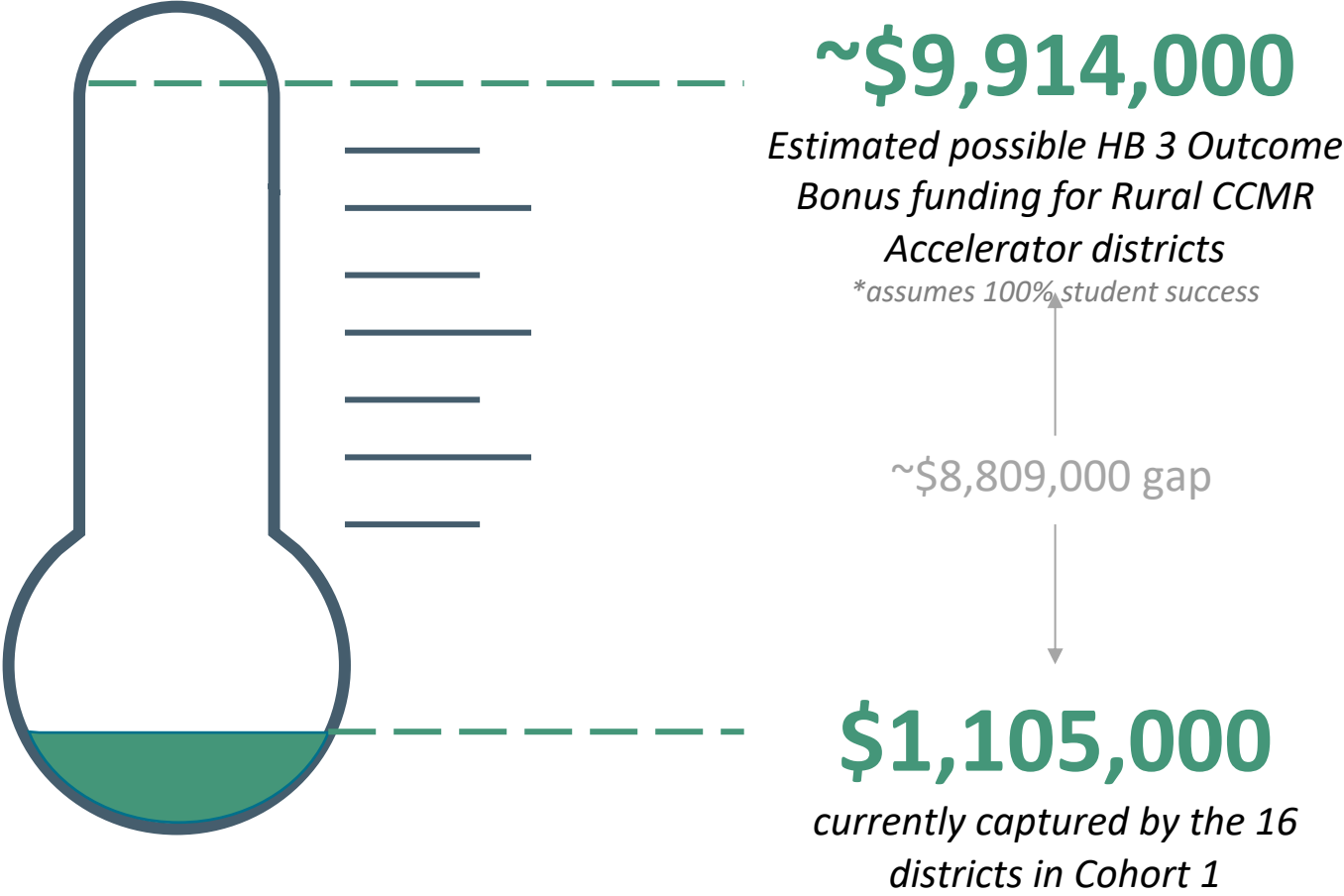
CCMR Outcomes Bonus Calculation

- CCMR bonuses are paid for each annual graduate above a certain threshold percentage**
- **\$3,000** for each annual graduate meeting the CCMR Outcomes Bonus definition of success above the threshold of 24%
 - **\$5,000** for each annual graduate in a family experiencing poverty meeting the CCMR Outcomes Bonus definition of success above the threshold of 11%
 - An **additional \$2,000** for each annual graduate meeting the CCMR Outcomes Bonus definition of success enrolled in special education

55% of the funding must be spent on improving CCMR for students in grades 8-12.

Note: Outcomes Bonus funding is calculated based on “annual graduates” not “cohort graduates.” Regardless of how many years it took a student to graduate, they will be included in the calculations of their graduating class.

Overview of 18-Month Program Cycle (Feb. 2022 – July 2023)

Ongoing, Direct Coaching and Support & Engagement in a Community of Practice

Analyze Student and Campus Level Data

Determine the effectiveness of current CCMR programming in graduating students who are college-ready and successfully transitioning to a post-secondary plan.

Build a CCMR Strategic Plan



Address gaps identified in the data analysis that specifically identifies strategies to increase TSI-readiness, enrollment in postsecondary education, and attainment of career credentials.

Implement & Monitor the CCMR Strategic Plan

Use continuous improvement cycles to monitor the effectiveness of selected interventions.

General Timeline of the Program



Districts are supported by Contigo Ed in collecting their own CCMR related data files.

Using your data, you create a "driver diagram" which sets your baselines, goals, and plans. This is built by you and supported by our team.

Throughout the Fall semester, you meet bi-weekly with a MAYA advisor and use a data tracker to make sure you are realizing your goals.

You continue to receive support as an alumni of the program.

The data is visualized so you can lead your district in a discussion centered on opportunities to grow CCMR outcomes.

You finalize your CCMR improvement plan, secure supports you feel will achieve results, and prepare to implement the plan.

In the Spring semester, you continue to work your plan with support from MAYA and predict your CCMR bonus – that is compared to your goals.

Network Improvement Community

Throughout this entire process, you build relationships and communicate with other districts like you that are striving to improve similar CCMR outcomes. Collaborating instead of consolidating – building rural vitality in Texas.

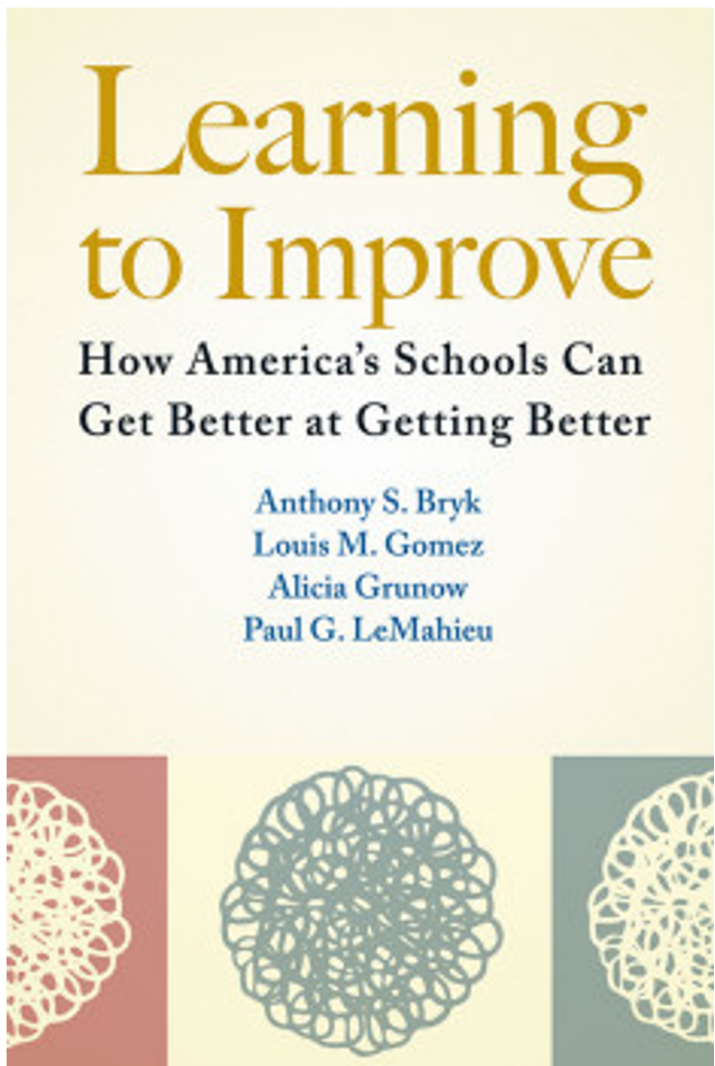
